

SENATOR HOWARD H. BAKER, JR.

SPECIAL CITATION FOR OUTSTANDING PUBLIC SERVICE

Senator Howard H. Baker, Jr., received a University of Tennessee College of Law Special Citation for Outstanding Public Service last fall when the awards were made for the first time to outstanding alumni.

After eighteen years of service in the United States Senate, eight of those in the leadership, Senator Baker chose to return to the practice of law, while continuing his interest in politics and considering current issues from another perspective.

Howard Baker is the senior partner in the Washington office and a member of the management committee of the Houston-based law firm, Vinson & Elkins. He also has reaffiliated with the Tennessee law firm that was founded by his grandfather, Baker, Worthington, Crossley, Stansberry and Woolf.

Serving two terms as Minority Leader and two terms as Majority Leader of the United States Senate, he was instrumental in forging Senate Republicans into "a convincing, cohesive force".

He has been described as "showing the instinctive understanding of how to exercise leadership and how to get others to move where you want them to go . . . (which is)

probably the art of all great leaders".

In 1966, he became the first Republican ever popularly elected to the Senate from Tennessee, and won re-election by wide margins in both 1972 and 1978.

As a candidate for President in 1980, Senator Baker won praise from supporters and competitors for his constructive, issue-oriented campaign.

He first won national recognition in 1973 as Vice Chairman of the Senate Watergate Committee, and he was keynote speaker at the Republican National Convention in 1976.

Senator Baker's father and mother both served in the U.S. House of Representatives. His father-in-law, the late Everett Dirksen of Illinois, was Republican Leader of the U.S. Senate from 1959 to 1969.

Before entering politics, he was an attorney and businessman in his hometown of Huntsville, Tennessee, and in Knoxville.

Following undergraduate studies at the University of the South and Tulane University, he received his law degree from The University of Tennessee, where he was student body president in 1949.

The Senator served three years in the U.S.

Navy as a lieutenant (jg), including a brief tour of duty as a PT boat officer in the South Pacific during World War II.

He serves on the boards of directors for AT&T, Gannett Co., Inc., and MCA. He is a member of the advisory board for Merrill Lynch and the board of trustees for the Mayo Clinic.

An avid photographer for more than forty years, his work has been displayed in galleries throughout the United States, in print and in national magazines.

The fifty-eight year old senator is married to the former Joy Dirksen. The Bakers have two children, Darek and Cissy, and two grandchildren, Daniel Dirksen Baker and Matthew Brandon Baker.

The applications for legal training continue to be quite varied in an ever more complex society, and our graduates reflect the diversity, the individualism, and the idealism of the age. They are self-reliant, competent, and desirous of service to others.

We welcome the opportunity to serve you, your firm or organization, and hope we can assist you in meeting your organization's staffing needs while also helping to fulfill the career aspirations of our students.

CAREER PLANNING & PLACEMENT SERVICES

Dear Employer,

You are invited and encouraged to use the services of the Office of Career Planning and Placement at the University of Tennessee College of Law in filling your employment needs—whether for permanent positions or summer clerkships requiring first- and second-year students.

The goal of the Office of Career Planning and Placement is to act as the best facilitator possible in matching the precise requirements of your position with the unique combination of academic background, individual talents, experience and interests in the law student or graduate who can best fill your hiring requirements.

In the process we hope you'll learn the special traits a graduate of our College has to offer—among which are not only a good grounding in the theoretical base on which to grow, but also the practical experience that has readied them upon graduation to write an effective brief and to communicate with people from all levels of society.

Using the Placement Office

As an employer, you can use our services to learn about potential employees in several ways. Arranging for on-campus interviews works out best for many, but other arrangements can be made for recruiters or hiring partners who can not schedule such visits. As an alternative, resumes of candidates

interested in your position description can be collected and forwarded to you, or such candidates can be instructed to contact you directly. For experienced graduates, a notice can be placed in our Employment Opportunities Newsletter for alumni.

After initially contacting us by letter or phone, you should follow one of the procedures described below to furnish us the detailed data that can save time and effort for employer and applicant alike in producing appropriate candidates.

- Complete and return an Employer Data Sheet which we furnish (or the form included with this booklet). Should you prefer, the detailed data can be given by phone, but ideally should be verified in writing.
- Send us your firm resume or a narrative that describes your practice and your community, the specific duties of the position you seek to fill and the special qualities and skills you deem important in a person who may become a part of your organization. Include instructions concerning to whom inquiries should be directed and in what manner.
- Notify the Office of Career Planning and Placement as soon as possible if changes in format or scheduling are desired.

- Contact each individual interviewed as soon as final disposition of his/her candidacy has been determined.
- Notify the Office of Career Planning and Placement when the position has been filled.

On-Campus Interviews

The on-campus interview can be the most economical in time and money, and in assuring the best student response. Though concentrated during the fall in September and October, on-campus interviews can be arranged year around, whether with third-year students seeking permanent positions or first-and second-year students seeking summer clerkships.

Reservations for fall interview dates begin in early spring by employers wishing to secure preferred dates but will be taken as long as space is available. Employers wishing to conduct campus interviews at any time during the year should contact us at least two weeks in advance to insure a full roster of appropriate candidates by the date set.

Southeastern Law Placement Consortium

Legal employers located a great distance from Knoxville can interview University of Tennessee law students with those from nine other quality Southern law schools through the facilities of the Southeastern Law Placement Consortium. The Consortium schedules a recruiting conference weekend each October in Atlanta. Complete information is available upon request.

Alumni Placement

The Office of Career Planning and Placement maintains contact with alumni who are seeking an employment change. The individuals include graduates who have experienced short-term employment in judicial clerkships, fellowships or military service, those who have pursued additional study, and those who have been in practice and are interested in changing the nature or location or their work. Should your vacant position require an experienced attorney, we urge you to request our publishing it in our bi-monthly Employment Opportunities Newsletter which is mailed to subscribing alumni.

Candidate Selection

Because employers best know the requirements of their positions and their organizations, we do not screen students for interviews. Within 24 hours after receipt, we post all job notices in the Placement Office for review by the entire student body. The employer may review the resumes submitted by a designated deadline and select to interview those applicants whose backgrounds most nearly match the position requirements. While we will do everything we can to facilitate the recruitment process, in fairness to all concerned we will not attempt to influence hiring decisions.

Committed to equal employment opportunity

for individuals regardless of race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin, handicap and/or veteran status, services of the Office of Career Planning and Placement are available only to employers whose practices coincide with this policy.

About Grades

Inevitably prospective employers concern themselves with grades. Please do not restrict your considerations totally to grade rankings or service on the law review. You may overlook very able students with personal qualities, interests, and backgrounds which are particularly desirable.

Though very important, grades and class rankings reflect a comparative quality of work and are not always indicative of the abilities of certain students.

Because our faculty is very demanding in its evaluation of student work, a meaningful interpretation of a student's transcript should consider the high expectations that must be met to achieve above average grades.

To aid in your evaluation of academic performance the following chart may be helpful.

LAW CENTER PROGRAMS & ORGANIZATIONS

Law Library

Containing more than 200,000 volumes, the law library is a comprehensive collection of primary U.S. legal source materials including state and federal court and legislative information as well as regulatory, agency and executive publications from both levels. Supporting this collection is a sizeable, quality selection of secondary materials which is curriculum- and research-oriented. These resources are available in a wide variety of formats, including computerized data base (WESTLAW), microforms, audio and video cassettes, looseleaf, periodical, serial, and monographic. The library has been a U.S. Government Documents Depository since 1972. A comprehensive, up-dated collection of Tennessee state legal materials is maintained in the library.

The library is served by a staff of thirteen including four full-time faculty members who are professional librarians. They provide a variety of reference, research, and training services to the students and faculty.

Legal Clinic

The University of Tennessee Legal Clinic was established in 1947. Through the process of providing legal assistance to indigent persons, the Clinic serves primarily as a teaching device to correlate theory and practice through personal contact with clients and their problems. The Legal Clinic functions as a large

law office in which the student gains experience in interviewing clients, writing legal letters, investigating and evaluating facts, preparing cases for trial or adjustment, and participating in actual cases. The student is thus trained in the technique of law practice and the management of a law office. The ethical responsibilities of lawyers and their function as public servants are stressed. Under present rules of the Tennessee Supreme Court, Clinic students, under the direct supervision of the Legal Clinic staff, are certified to practice before all the courts of Tennessee.

Public Law Institute

The Public Law Institute conducts research and service projects and publishes several comprehensive books on Tennessee law. The Institute is a non-profit organization dedicated to serving the needs of Tennessee's judiciary, its legal community, and its citizens.

The Tennessee Judicial Newsletter is edited entirely by law students. Published bi-monthly, this journal features concise and up-to-date summaries of developments in Tennessee case law, federal case law, and state legislation. The subscription list includes judges, attorneys, and other court-related personnel.

The Street Law Mock Trial Competition is an annual statewide event which originated with the Public Law Institute. In cooperation with the Tennessee Young Lawyers Conference, teams of students from area high schools take on the

roles of attorneys and witnesses in a hypothetical trial in this test of verbal and analytical skills. Law students and local attorneys serve as coaches for each team, and after several preliminary rounds a local champion is chosen to represent the area in the statewide event. It is a valuable learning experience for coaches and team members alike.

The purpose of the Public Law Institute is to create opportunities for the law school's faculty and students to engage in legal research and public service activities which foster a positive attitude toward the law and those involved in the legal system.

The Tennessee Law Review

The Tennessee Law Review is a legal periodical published quarterly by the faculty and students of the College of Law.

Candidates for the Review are selected on the basis of scholarship and writing ability. The editorial board of the Review is composed of upper-class students.

The *Review* offers an excellent opportunity to those students with the requisite legal aptitude and industry to do legal research and writing of a scholarly and practical nature. Notes and comments upon important recent decisions are prepared by each student editor under the supervision of the law faculty and are published in the *Review*.

A student may not serve on the editorial

board while also participating in Moot Court Board activities or while serving as a student instructor in the Research and Writing Program.

Moot Courts

All students are eligible to compete for a place on various intra- and inter-law school Moot Court teams. There is an annual Law Day Competition and the College of Law participates in the National Inter-Law School Moot Court Competition. Regional winners in this competition compete in final arguments at the national level. Teams from the Law College have frequently won honors in the regional competition, and in 1976 UT's team won the final round of the national competition in New York City. The 1981 team composed of Wanda Glenn, Tom Slagle, and Luann Smith again took top honors in this prestigious competition. The 1982 team of Tom Slagle, Luann Smith, and Scott Rose placed second in the nation.

Similar programs are conducted by the Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition, the Glles Sutherland Rich Patent Law Moot Court Competition, the Frederick Douglass Moot Court Competition, the Wagner Labor Law Moot Court Competition, and the Irving R. Kaufman Securities Law Moot Court Competition.

The Advocates' Prize Moot Court
Competition was established through the
generosity of a good friend of the College of
Law. After extensive intra-school competition,
final arguments are made at the annual Law
Day program. Customarily, a panel of three
judges hears the final arguments. In 1984 the
panel was led by the Honorable Sam J. Ervin

III, U.S. Court of Appeals, Fourth Judicial Circuit. The other panel members were the Honorable Odell Horton, U.S. District Court, Western District of Tennessee, and the Honorable Eugene E. Siler, Jr., U.S. District Court, Eastern and Western Districts of Kentucky. Prizes are awarded on the basis of outstanding brief, best oral argument, and best appellate advocacy team.

For further practical experience, students are encouraged to visit the courts of all types (criminal, civil, equity, state, and federal, including the Court of Appeals of Tennessee and the Supreme Court of Tennessee) which hold their sessions in the city of Knoxville.

The Moot Court Board is composed of thirdvear students who have demonstrated appellate advocacy ability through various interand intra-school competitions. The Board develops the problem and coordinates all the activities for the Advocates' Prize Moot Court Competition and is involved in the selection of other Moot Court teams representing the Law College. In order to increase the development of advocacy skills, the Board has developed a videotape library. In addition, the Board sponsors various trial and appellate court hearings at the Law College. The Tennessee Court of Appeals has for the past five years regularly held one day of "live" appellate arguments in the College.

The Order of the Coif

The Order of the Coif is a national law school honor society, election to which depends upon exceptional scholastic attainment. Only those students who, at the time of their graduation,

are among the first tenth of their class are eligible. Election is made by the law faculty and is the highest honor regularly conferred by the College of Law.

Student Bar Association

The UT Student Bar Association is the representative voice of the students of the College of Law. All students may join the SBA and participate in its activities.

The SBA supervises the locker rental program and operates the SBA Bookmobile, through which law students may buy and sell used law books. The SBA also administers the Alan Novak Memorial Emergency Loan Fund which provides short-term, interest-free loans to law students in need.

Throughout the year the SBA sponsors speakers, films, student-faculty coffees, and various social functions. The SBA also develops a student directory for its members and sponsors a student advisor program for all first-year students. In addition, the SBA coordinates a broad range of Law Week activities each spring.

Black Law Student Association

The Black Law Student Association at the University of Tennessee is a member of the National Black Law Student Association. Devoted to the articulation and promotion of the needs and goals of Black law students, BLSA attempts to increase the awareness and commitment of the legal profession to the black community. Skills are developed by participation in events such as the Frederick Douglass Moot Court

Competition, community projects, and conferences. Finally, the BLSA is concerned with dispensing information pertaining to legal study to interested Black Students, and with soliciting and awarding funds, grants, and scholarships to Black Law Students.

Association of Trial Lawyers of America— Student Chapter

The goal of the Student Chapter of the Association of Trial Lawyers of America is to provide students with exposure to the field of trial advocacy through the use of speakers and other educational programs. Membership in the organization also affords students the opportunity to participate in seminars and other programs offered by the National and State Trial Lawyers Associations.

Law Women

The Law Women organization offers a diversity of programs, with speakers on legal topics such as assertiveness training, police work, and spouse beating. Law Women also offers the opportunity to work in community and University projects. It provides informative assistance to the Rape Crisis Center, and in conjunction with the Women's Center and other University departments has sponsored conferences on women in education, employment discrimination, and women's health. It also provides information pertaining to current litigation and pending legislation of interest to women.

Law Women engages in projects with other schools, and members regularly attend the

regional and national conferences on women and the law.

East Tennessee Lawyers' Guild

The East Tennessee Lawyers' Guild is a group of law students interested in using their legal skills to serve the total community and to promote basic political and economic change. The ETLG is a chapter of the National Lawyers Guild, an organization which seeks "to unite the lawyers, law students, legal workers and jailhouse lawyers of America . . . to the end that human rights shall be regarded as more sacred than property interests."

Ongoing projects initiated by the ETLG include the development of resource materials and instruction on legal rights for high school students and indigent prisoners in Tennessee. A speakers program has brought people to the law school to discuss issues ranging from reform of conditions at the local jail to national lobbying efforts against repressive legislation. Members see the Guild as a place where they can get support and cooperation for concerns as diverse as environmental protection, public interest law, minority rights, and personal adjustment to legal study.

Student Legal Assistance Program

"SLAP" is an organization of law student volunteers who serve as student defenders within the University community. It provides opportunity to develop advocacy skills as well as providing needed representation to University students. Most of the student

defenders' caseloads involve the defense of undergraduate students accused of violating University Standards of Conduct. This requires prehearing investigation and preparation of cases for adjudication, as well as familiarization with and implementation of appropriate University procedure, including written briefs and oral arguement.

The Forum

As the student newspaper of the Law College, the *Forum* seeks to provide a vehicle for the expression of student views on a wide range of subjects. Constructive criticism is encouraged and numerous questions concerning curriculum, teaching methods, and grading practices have been aired through this medium.

Legal Fraternities

Two of the largest national legal fraternities maintain active chapters at the College of Law. The Roosevelt Inn of Phi Delta Phi Legal Fraternity was established at the Law College in 1919. The McReynolds Chapter of Phi Alpha Delta Legal Fraternity was founded at the College of Law in 1916.

The legal fraternities have traditionally played a leading role in College of Law affairs, professional as well as social. Weekly luncheon programs and roundtable discussions and lectures feature addresses by prominent speakers drawn from the legal profession and from commerce and industry. A "ride-along" program with the Knoxville Police Department is also sponsored. The fraternities foster a

consciousness of the ideals of the legal profession and good fellowsip among their members.

Christian Legal Society

The Christian Legal Society is a recognized student organization in the University of Tennessee system. The society conducts weekly meetings, annual retreats, and invites guest lecturers to the College of Law. The purpose of the Christian Legal Society is to give serious, honest, and intelligent consideration to the role the Christian lawyer plays in today's legal system, while also providing Christian fellowship for students at George C. Taylor Law Center.

The Federalist Society

The UT chapter of The Federalist Society for Law & Public Policy Studies is an organization of conservatives interested in the current state of legal order. Its purpose is to stimulate thought and to encourage application of conservative principles to the law. The Society is founded on the principles that the State exists to preserve freedom, and that the separation of powers is central to our Constitution. In promoting these principles the Society seeks to create a conservative intellectual network extending to all levels of the legal community.

The Federalist Society participates in national and regional symposia, and sponsors a variety of activities including speaker meetings, faculty debates, and public interest research.






