



Admissions Report

nce again we can report that applications have soared. While the national pool for students applying to law schools in the Fall of 1990 grew 6.4%, the pool grew 17% for The University of Tennessee College of Law. This year, 1104 students applied to the College - 567 Tennessee residents and 537 residents from other states. In just two years, the number of out-of-state applicants has increased by 223 while the number of Tennessee residents seeking admission has increased by 86. As we noted in the last annual report, we are proud of the fact that we are becoming nationally well-known for providing a quality education. As the reputation of our faculty has grown, more and more students from all over the country want to attend the College.

As the accompanying charts indicate, numerical credentials were much higher than those of previous classes, with a median undergraduate grade point average (UGPA) of 3.42 and a median LSAT score of 36, a figure reflective of the 75th percentile of testtakers. The high UGPA was 4.37 (on a 0.0 to 4.0 scale!) while the high LSAT was 48 (on a scale of 10-48). You can't do much better than that.

Diversity is so widely touted as to have become a buzzword in academe recently. Although we rebel against complacency as we review our efforts, the College can be proud of its accomplishments over the past few years. Forty-three percent (43%) of the class is female, 11% belong to racial minority groups, both very important factors as we strive to make our profession much more reflective of the world. They hail from eleven (11) states with 84% of the students from Tennessee. North Carolina, Virginia, California, and Ohio residents make up the bulk of the remainder, and one student hails from the beautiful island of Jamaica.

This diverse group has graduated from 71 undergraduate institutions: 45 from UT, Knoxville, 7 from Vanderbilt, 7 from East Tennessee State University, 6 from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and 4 from UT, Chattanooga. Their chosen fields of study are similar to those in previous classes, 35 with degrees in Political Science, 21 in History, 14 in English, 10 in Accounting and Psychology, and 9 in Business Management. In all, they represent 35 distinct fields of study.

All of this serves to make us a better place and a place about which faculty, staff, alumni, and friends can be justifiably proud. Our recent successes continue to make the College an exciting place for learning and for preparing for our cherished profession.







Innovative Teaching

Gary Anderson, Jerry Black, Susan Kovac, and Nicki Russler

...revised materials for the new sixhour clinical offerings in Civil and Criminal Advocacy.

Fran Ansley

...incorporated "reflection papers" into the course in Discrimination and the Law, in which the students wrote about the readings in light of their personal histories and experiences. Teams of students conducted some of the classes in unusual formats (a Congressional debate in the year of the Dred Scott decision; a school board meeting on the issue of whether high school students should be required to study the history of slavery).

...assigned her first-year Property students to do a title search on a parcel of Knox County property.

Tom Davies

...developed a new course on The Supreme Court, using original materials, focusing on the role played by factors such as differences in judicial backgrounds and orientations in the decisions of the high court.

Larry Dessem

...revised and supplemented the materials for his Pre-Trial Litigation course, which will shortly be published by the West Publishing Company. In response to student demand, a second section of this course was added in 1989-90, taught by the Hon. Robert Murrian, the United States Magistrate in Knoxville. Students in this course develop a litigation plan, draft a complaint, prepare discovery requests and settlement documents, conduct simulated client interviews and depositions in class, argue motions, and attempt to negotiate a settlement. They also attend pretrial proceedings in federal court and write papers concerning their observations.

...asked students in Government Contracts (a course team-taught by Professor Pierce and three experienced attorneys from Oak Ridge) to prepare a bid protest to the General Accounting Office, negotiate a contract covering proprietary data rights in a research and development contract, and critique and redraft the Federal Acquisition Regulation's standard inspection clause.

Glenn Reynolds

...selected a notice of proposed rulemaking (with proposed regulations on automobile passive restraints) from the Federal Register and asked his students in Administrative Law to draft comments on the proposed regulations which were then filed with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and became part of the agency's rulemaking docket.

...supplemented the standard course materials in International Business Transactions with sample documents including bills of lading, antidumping and countervailing duty petitions, and customs forms, and assigned students five practical research problems (e.g, locating local counsel in the Philippines, or determining what documents are necessary to import samples for trade-show purposes without having to pay customs duties) designed to familiarize them with the techniques and materials used by practitioners in international trade.



Development Report

Significant Developments in 1989-90

Law Library Gift-in-Kind

Dewey R. Roark, Jr. of Creston, North Carolina, Class of '49, contributed a number of IRS Cumulative Bulletins, Treasury Decisions and related tax reference materials to the College of Law Library. Mr. Roark's gift was from his private tax library and some of the pieces of the collections, which was valued at \$5,000, dated back to 1918.

Klebler E. Dunklin Law Library Endowment

Klebler E. Dunklin, of Waynesville, North Carolina, established a charitable remained trust at the College of Law with a stock gift valued at over \$25,000. The gift has been designated to establish the Klebler E. Dunklin Law Library Endowment for future acquisition of books and other reference materials in the Law Library. Mr. Dunklin is a 1941 graduate of the College of Law.

Legal History Endowment Established

Memphis attorneys Robert M. Friedman and Ben G. Sissman, both 1975 graduates of the College of Law, have collectively pledged \$15,000 to establish the Law Offices of Friedman and Sissman, P.C. Legal History Law Library Endowment. Annual income from the endowment will be used to benefit the UT College of Law Library for the purchase of books, journals, periodicals and related materials in the field of legal history.

Two Atlanta Area Attorneys Contribute \$5,000 Each

W. Allen Separk, Class of 1968, of Marietta, Georgia, and Joel A. Katz, Class of 1969, of the Atlanta firm of Katz & Cherry, each contributed \$5,000 to the College's 1989-90 Annual Fund Campaign. The two contributions were the largest unrestricted gifts the College received last year, and helped the College set an all-time record of \$111,012 in unrestricted support...double the amount received just two years ago. Both Separk and Katz are charter members of the College of Law Dean's Circle, a group of alumni and friends committed to improving the College's base of financial support.

Elsie Naomi Jones Scholarship Endowment

A gift of \$25,000 from Gladys Stamm Boester, of Arlington, Virginia, established a named scholarship in memory and honor of her friend, Elsie Naomi Jones. Miss Jones was born in Chattanooga and attended the Chattanooga School of Law in the 1930's. She worked for the U.S. Justice Department in Washington, D.C. and died in 1987. Mrs. Boester graduated from the Washington University School of Law in St. Louis, Missouri.

James C. Kirby, Jr. and Barbara Eggleston Kirby Scholarship Endowed

A gift of \$20,000 from Barbara Eggleston Kirby coupled with memorial contributions received honoring Jim Kirby, have permanently endowed the James C. Kirby, Jr. and Barbara Eggleston Kirby Scholarship at the College of Law. The scholarships will benefit first-year law students from Davidson, Macon & Williamson Counties and will be awarded on the basis of academic performance. Jim Kirby retired from the College of Law faculty in July 1989 and died on October 14, 1989.

Kingsport Bar Establishes Scholarship Endowment

Gifts from Kingsport area firms and individual members of the Kingsport Bar Association totalling \$10,000 have established a scholarship endowment for the benefit of local law students. M. Lacy West, President of the Kingsport Bar Association, initiated the project and headed the fund-raising drive. The first scholarship will be awarded from the interest earned on the endowment in 1991. The scholarships will be awarded on the basis of merit and financial need, and will be available to UT law students from Sullivan, Hawkins, Washington, Johnson, or Carter Counties.

Ritchie & Wise Scholarship

The Knoxville law firm of Ritchie Wise announced plans to support a full-tuition in-state scholarship with annual gifts of \$2,500. The scholarships will be awarded to first-year students on the basis of academic performance. Wilson S. Ritchie is a partner in the firm and member of the UT College of Law Class of '66.

Richard T. Sowell Memorial Scholarship Endowment Established

In memory of their partner, Richard Sowell, the members of the law firm of Baker, Worthington, Crossley, Stansberry & Woolf established the Richard T. Sowell Memorial Scholarship with a pledge of \$20,000 payable in two years. Individual members of the firm have also committed additional funds to the endowment. Richard Sowell was a 1973 graduate of the College of Law and had been a partner with Baker, Worthington since 1976. He died after a lengthy illness on November 20, 1989.

Matthews-Jeter Scholarship Endowment Created

A gift of \$10,000 from Mrs. Mary S. Jeter of Jackson, Mississippi coupled with a Presidents' Club commitment from J. Payson Matthews III, Class of '59, of Somerville, has established a new scholarship endowment for the benefit of students from West Tennessee. The scholarships created by this endowment will be awarded for superior academic performance to qualified UT law students from one of eight specified West Tennessee counties. Mrs. Jeter is the aunt of Payson Matthew, and the great-aunt of Blake Matthews, a 1986 UT law graduate, of Nashville.

James R. Omer Scholarship Endowment Established with College's Largest Commitment of the Year.

Prominent Nashville trial attorney, James R. Omer, has pledged \$44,000, payable over four years, to establish a scholarship endowment for the benefit of law students from Davidson, Williamson and Weakly Counties. Interest earned on the endowment will provide full-tuition in-state scholarships for academically superior and financially-needy UT law students. Jim Omer is a 1963 graduate of the College of Law and hereceived the College's Alumni Leadership award in 1990. His pledge was the largest cash commitment made to the College of Law in FY 1989-90.

Class of 1990 Pledge \$10,000 as Their Gift to the College

The members of the Class of 1990 are gone but not forgotten. It left behind a pledge of \$10,000 to establish a new scholarship endowment and the first-

ever senior class giving program at UT-Knoxville and the College of Law. An eight-member Class of 1990 Development Council organized the effort and pledge drive. Many of the graduating students pledged between \$150-\$750 toward the endowment payable over a five-year period. Interest earned from the endowment will be awarded annually to a third-year law student based on academic performance and financial need.

Student Organization Generates \$10,000 for Public Interest Law Stipends

In 1990 UT law students established the Tennessee Association of Public Interest Law (TAPIL) and organized its first fund-raising effort. During a one-week pledge drive, TAPIL officers received commitments totalling nearly \$10,000 from faculty, students, and local attorneys to be used to supplement the summer salaries of students pursing careers in public interest law. Three stipends of \$1,000 each were awarded to students during the summer of 1990.

Waller Lansden Dortch & Davis Announce \$25,000 Commitment

The Nashville law firm of Waller Lansden Dortch & Davis has pledged \$25,000 to further academic excellence and development at the College of Law. Of the total commitment, \$15,000 will establish two annual \$1,500 scholarships for the next five years. One scholarship will be offered solely to second-year minority students, while the other will be available to all second-year students. The remaining \$10,000 is designated for the building fund for the proposed new facility.

Feasibility Study Completed

The College's first comprehensive development analysis/feasibility study was conducted and completed in fiscal year 1989-90. Eighty-six individuals, representing a cross-section of the College's leadership, wereinterviewedfrom December 1989 through March 1990 to test the feasibility of a major fundraising campaign (\$4.75 million) for the College of Law. The study was conducted by the independent consulting firm of Jerold Panas, Young & Partners, Inc. and was presented to College of Law and University administrators in April 1990.

The Law Library


aw libraries have traditionally served as the laboratories and resource centers of legal education as well as its resultant practitioners. The Law Library of The University of Tennessee College of Law continues that tradition by providing research services to its students and faculty and a resource base for its area bench and bar.

In addition to basic resource materials, the Library also provides access to the OCLC network for interlibrary loans, CD-ROM based legal information indexes, computers, computerized data searches, and a U.S. Government Documents Selective Depository. With the exception of the WESTLAW and LEXIS databases, the collection of the Law Library is available for use by all students, faculty, members of the practicing bar, and the general public.

The Law Library serves its clientele with a staff of nine full-time employees, four full-time faculty and one part-time faculty. More than one-third of the staff and faculty are now devoted exclusively to the provision of readers' services in reference, interlibrary loan, reserve, circulation, etc.

The collection has grown 20% over the past five years. Over the same period of time, the acquisitions

budget has also increased 20% in an effort to keep pace with the ever-increasing cost of legal reference materials. Seventy-seven percent of the acquisitions budget is used merely to keep the core collection of reporters, looseleaf services, digests, periodicals, and monographs current. In a normal year less than 10% of the total acquisitions budget is available for purchase of new titles.

The five-year comparison chart shows that the Law Library now includes over 315,000 volumes and microform equivalent volumes in the collection.


An essential resource today in legal education as well as in legal research, the computer has become an integral tool in the effective provision of Law Library services. In addition to providing the research capabilities of WESTLAW and LEXIS to students and faculty, the Law Library only this year has been designated a "Permanent Learning Center" for both of the database resources. Necessary equipment and appropriate personnel are provided for the training of students and faculty by the database companies. The Law Library has moved into other areas of technological innovation with its provision of access to Legal-Trac, a CD-ROM index of legal periodicals and government documents, as well as access to CALI, a series of legal instruction programs produced by the Centerfor Computer-Assisted Legal Instruction. These programs are only one of the services available to the students in the Library's new computer research and instruction laboratory which makes the computer equipment accessible for the wide variety of student needs. Plans are under way for the acquisition of the WILSONLINE Index to Legal Periodicals on CD-ROM as well as two computer-based programs designed to give basic instruction in legal research.

Although currently limited somewhat by the physical design of the Law Center and the rapidly decreasing amount of available shelf space, the Law Library continues to build and maintain an adequate and useful core research collection. To aid in the assurance of the ongoing quality of this significant resource, a Collection Development Policy has been developed which should guide the Library through difficult decision-making processes.

Career Services

hoices of practice emphasis and geographic location have remained largely consistent for University of Tennessee College of Law graduates for the past five years. Based on the returns of those students responding to employment surveys, the large majority of graduates choose the private practice of law. The average number going to private firms for the Classes of 1985-1989 was 67 percent, while from the Class of 1989 alone, 73 percent chose private firms.

Of those from the Class of 1989 accepting employment with private firms, half chose "very small firms" with 2-10 members, 30 percent went to "small firms" with 11-25 members, 6.5 percent to "medium firms" with 26-50 members, and 6.5 percent to "large firms" with 51-100 members. Two were employed by firms with over 100 members and one chose solo practice. Other practice categories are outlined in the accompanying chart.

Knoxville remains the location of choice for the greatest percentage of the graduates. An average of one-fourth of each class for the last five years has remained in Knoxville, with 30 percent of the Class of 1989 doing so. These figures may lend credence to the popular notion that Knoxville is "saturated" with attorneys.

Knoxville's gain may be Nashville's loss where the 16 percent five-year average for graduate location dropped to 10 percent for the Class of 1989. The Chattanooga five-year average of 14 percent endured, with Memphis also remaining steady at about 5 percent, and "all other" Tennessee towns at about 20 percent. The continuing 20 percent average for graduates locating out of state roughly approximates the number of out-of- state students in each entering class.

Despite a drop in the number of firms interviewing on campus in 1989-90 to 87 from 105 in 1988-1989, by six months after graduation 92.37 percent of the Class of 1989 whose status was known had accepted employment, 90 percent in legal or law-related positions. This compares with 1988 status-known graduates, of whom 93.8 percent were employed within six months, and 1987 status-known graduates, of whom 93.65 percent were employed within six months.

Salary information was provided by 67 graduates of the 109 from the Class of 1989 listing employment. The average salary for all categories was \$32, 941. Out-of-state salaries averaged \$45,787 (12 of 22 students reporting). Average salaries in-state were: Knoxville, \$29,357(21/33 reporting); Nashville, \$35,188 (8/11 reporting); Chattanooga,\$32,995 (13/16 reporting); Memphis, \$33,167 (3/5 reporting); and other Tennessee towns, \$25,182 (11/24 reporting).

Use of the Career Services facility and resources by students remained steady in 1989-1990. From the Class of 1992 entering Fall 1989, 127/160 (79.4 percent) participated in the hour-long small-group orientation sessions offered in late December and early January. The number of students from each class that registered to use Career Services was: Class of 1992, 135/161 (93.9 percent); Class of 1991, 145/160 (90.6 percent), and Class of 1990, 126/151 (83.4 percent.) Students who register each receive a copy of the Career Services Handbook which includes information about the office and its programs, practice specialities, how to write resumes and interview, a career bibliography, and the like.

Lawyers of the Future, the student picturebook in which participation is voluntary and without charge, remains popular with students, employers and alumni/ae. Participation in the edition produced during the 1989-1990academic year was 85.5 percent for the Class of 1991 and 80.6 percent for the Class of 1992. Photos of faculty members have been included for the last two years, so that the booklet has become popular in introducing students and professors to each other, as well as introducing our students to employers.






