TENNESSEE WINS REGIONAL TRIAL COMPETITION

Eleven law schools from Arkansas, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee competed in Little Rock, Feb. 13-15, for the regional National Trial Competition championship. The competition, which is sponsored by the American Bar Association's Young Lawyers Division and Litigation Section as well as by the American College of Trial Lawyers and the Texas Young Lawyers, is designed to test the trial advocacy skills of the participants. The teams were prepared to represent either the prosecution or the defense in a bank robbery case. The College of Law's team of Tom Bickers, Daniel Clayton, and Scott Davis defeated teams from Memphis State University, the University of Arkansas at Little Rock, and two different teams from Wake Forest University to win the regional event. The team's faculty advisors are Professor Gary Anderson and Professor Larry Dessem.

The second team from UT, Tricia Mogan, Julie Taylor, and Steve Rothenburg defeated a team from the University of Mississippi before losing to the team from South Carolina, which proceeded to become co-champion of the region.

Tennessee and South
Carolina, along with the top
two teams from each of the
other ten regions, will
compete for the national title
March 18-21 in San Antonio,
