Dear Judge Lane,

AMR bankruptcy could impact my life in a very serious way, if my pension is lost or reduced. I retired in 2010, when I was 66 years of age and relying on my pension from AMR along with my Social Security check each month. If I do not have the AMR pension it means I will have to find a job as I cannot live on Social Security alone at \$963 a month. At 68 years of age finding employment particularly in this economy is highly unlikely.

This is a life threatening issue as far as I'm personally concerned. When one's pension cannot be relied upon having contributed in good faith for many years, and then discover the company participation has been found wanting, after bankruptcy has been declared, and the least able to help themselves are inflicted. You work your entire life and try to plan for it the best way you can.

I feel our full pension should be paid particularly for retirees and those close to retirement who are no longer able to seek alternative remedies to compensate for the loss, and consequently suffer unnecessary hardship. For the younger element that are still able to continue employment that part of their pension which has been accumulated should be paid into an annuity or similar plan. But in any event those monies plus the company contracted contribution must be made available to the employees past and present.

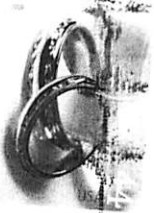
